

From game shows to cruise ships, twirlers from across the country are bringing baton twirling to new national and global audiences.

Baton twirlers such as former Men's Solo Grand National Champion and current Board member Jonathan Burkin, have appeared on "America's Got Talent." Others have become involved in the circus arts community. Additionally, through the power of social media, some twirlers have been given incredible and sometimes unusual opportunities to share their love for the sport. Whether it is through television, social media or



production companies, baton twirlers have been welcomed into the entertainment industry.

Jennifer Marcus

Marcus is the "winningest athlete in the history of USTA" with 43 Grand National titles to her name. After she retired from competitive twirling, she had the chance to perform on stage in Cirque du Soleil's "Volta."

These days, she's performing on a slightly smaller stage, sometimes surrounded by water!

Marcus twirls fire on a five-foot-byfive-foot stage at Setai in Miami
Beach, Florida. Through circus
connections, Marcus has been hired
by several production companies to
perform at a different restaurants,
clubs, and other establishments
throughout South Florida. At Setai,
Marcus is an "ambient" twirler,
entertaining guests as they enjoy their
dinner, drinks, or party.

"This requires a lot of agility and creativeness as you never know where the crowd is, where people might be walking, what the ceiling height is, or any changing factors throughout the event," Marcus said.




Joel Claudio Martinez

Joel Claudio Martinez first started to reach new audiences through Tik Tok, Instagram, and Facebook. Since then, he has twirled on "America's Got Talent" and the "Huckabee" talk show. He was also hired to perform

in "The Greatest Show on the Seven Seas" on Sambuca, a Norwegian Cruise Lines ship. He's also scheduled to perform at an NBA basketball halftime.

"It was just another opportunity to showcase





baton twirling and to show the world that we are a sport and that we are here, we are growing, and we are making ourselves better every day," Claudio Martinez said.





Cody Carter

Carter, a senior at Arizona State University, has taken twirling to a variety of audiences with his unique twirling style and dance moves. Carter won the Emerging Pro Manipulation award at his first international circus competition and Drake's "Toosie Slide" dance challenge. Carter was also featured on ESPN by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer, Bill Walton. In December 2021, Carter was invited to perform at Arizona's largest annual music festival, Decadence.

"It gave me a feel of what it was like to portray a character and be in a costume that correlated with the theme of this spectacular event," Carter said. "The music was loud with thousands of people there and once again, I got to introduce twirling - with my LED lighted batons - to a group of people that may have never seen it before."

The LED lighted batons were also a fan favorite on Fox's "Game of Talents" when many-time national and world champion Mark Nash and his two daughters, Olivia and Julianna, performed.

Originally, the sisters planned to share their talent on stage together. But at a pre-production Zoom meeting, the producers asked if Mark would join his daughters as it was interesting to have a father do the same talent as his children. As the lights came up and the cover lifted, the family brought an energy-filled performance to the show.

"Even our background dancers were supportive before our performance," said Olivia Nash, "dancing with us backstage and such to help us get our nerves out since it was a live taping."

Whether it is Tik Tok, television or live performances, baton twirlers throughout the country have shared their love for the sport with new audiences around the world.

"Spreading and introducing baton twirling around the world on television makes me even happier because I hope that baton twirling will one day be in the Olympics," Julianna Nash said.

Meet Julia Arciola, 2022 Collegiate Champion and University of Illinois Feature Twirler

How did it feel to be awarded the Miller Cup?

When this award was created in 2016, I remember being a sophomore in high school, I was so incredibly excited to twirl in college. I watched in awe as some of the greatest twirlers in the country competed for this prestigious award,



and ever since that summer, I've had my eye on the collegiate competition. I'm so honored to be part of the history of the Miller Cup and share this experience and award with those who have won in the past, and all of those who will win in the future. And for that, I'm very lucky.

Take us through the moment they announced your name as the Collegiate Champion.

Since none of the athletes are aware of the scores for this event ahead of time, I had no idea what to expect. This was one of those moments where I knew I had done the absolute best I could do, so I just had to trust that wherever I was placed was where I was supposed to be. When my name was called as the Collegiate Champion, my world went quiet. It was a moment when I finally felt like every sacrifice, every bleeding finger, every practice, and every tear was worth it. It's a moment I will never forget.

What is it like being the University of Illinois feature twirler? At the University of Illinois, being the feature twirler is being treated like royalty. The immense support and love I receive from the university, the students, the faculty, the Champaign-Urbana community, and the Marching Illini is like no other. My band director, Professor Barry Houser, has given me so much autonomy to be the feature twirler in my own way. I get to show my personality in every performance, every interview, and most

importantly, in my everyday life. There is no 'cookie cutter' way to be the University of Illinois feature twirler, and I hope that my successor finds a way to make this position their own.

What is your favorite part of game day?

Without a doubt, my favorite part of gameday is running onto the field during pregame. As the feature twirler, I have the



honor of getting to lead the 400+ Marching Illini onto the field of Memorial Stadium. As I run onto the field, at the 50-yard-line, I get to hear the announcement "The Marching Illini Feature Twirler, 2022 Grand National Champion from Boca Raton, Florida... Julia Arciola." Being able to share this experience with 400 of my closest friends and looking out into a stadium full of my peers (and most importantly, my parents) is something that I'll cherish forever.

What advice do you have for other collegiate twirlers and aspiring collegiate twirlers?

My biggest piece of advice is to trust your gut. I remember four years ago when I was in the same position as most graduating seniors; I was scared, anxious, confused, excited, and worried about what this next chapter of my life was going to look like. Please remember that what is right for someone else, might not be what's right for you, and that's okay. Find the place that makes you feel at home — you'll know when you find it.

WBTF HONORS SANDI WIEMERS



The World Baton Twirling Federation (WBTF) recognized twirling icon Sandi Wiemers for her longtime contributions to the WBTF and the sport of baton twirling during the closing ceremonies of the 35th World Baton Twirling Championship, which was held in August in Turin, Italy.

Wiemers is the current WBTF president, a position she has held for 14 years (2008-2022). Prior to that, she served six years as WBTF vice-president (2002-2008) and eight years as WBTF

Board Member Representative for USTA (1996-2002). In all, Wiemers has been part of the WBTF leadership for 26 years.

During that time, the WBTF worked to expand the sport of baton twirling to more countries around the world, which is one necessary step toward being recognized as an Olympic sport.

USTA has also benefited from Wiemers' leadership and dedication. During the past 51 years, she has been a coach, a judge, a member of every USTA committee or commission, as well as a member of the USTA Board of Directors for 20 years, 12 of those years as president. She was instrumental in the development of a new business plan and structure for USTA and the improvement of training programs for coaches and judges. She was also the driving force behind the development of USTA's first website; a computer tabulation program for competitions; an online membership and entry registration system; and an online accounting system for USTA. She was inducted into the USTA Hall of Fame in 2013.


2022 marked the last WBTF World Championship, as the next World Championship will be hosted by the International Baton Twirling Federation (IBTF), an organization of both WBTF and WNBTA organizations. It will be held in August 2023 in Liverpool, England. Wiemers also serves as the IBTF president.


